#### **Resistance to Tyranny Is Obedience to God**

The title of this article is a quote from John Knox. Knox, who was a Scottish Presbyterian Pastor, resisted the reign of Mary Queen of Scots. The queen was persecuting Christians.

Is it right to submit to authority which is ungodly? The Bible tells us to submit to authority - even that of ungodly men (Romans 13:1-7).

But the difference is this - the Christian cannot submit to an ungodly government which forces the Christian to disobey God and violate his conscience.

#### Kim Davis, the Brave County Clerk

When the US supreme court allowed for same-sex marriage, it became a federal ruling that affected all the states.

Across that nation, gay couples started to apply to get married. Kim Davis, who was a county clerk in Kentucky, refused to issue marriage licenses.

She was told that she needed to start issuing marriage licenses or quit her job.

She refused to do either. Her reason? She is a Christian. Kim Davis became a Christian only four years ago.

She said, "I promised to love Him with all my heart, mind and soul because I wanted to make heaven my home... God's moral law conflicts with my job duties. You can't be separated from something that's in your heart and in your soul."

At the same time, Kim Davis, as county clerk is an elected official. She exercises the will of the people. If she does not, then she can be impeached or voted out of office. What should she do? Obey her conscience or fulfill her role as an elected official?

If she obeys her conscience she is in contempt of court. If she carries out her role, she is in contempt of God.

When Courts Become Contemptible

I believe what she did was right. To have carried out the orders of the courts would have violated her conscience.

The reason for this is because the courts have become contemptible.

It was completely legal and sanctioned by the Nazi courts and legislation for German clerks during the Third Reich to stamp and process all the paper work to expedite the transfer of Jews to Auschwitz or Dachau.

Yet, most of the world would have cheered if this clerk had been prosecuted and found guilty during the trials of Nuremberg.

And it was completely illegal for someone like Oskar Schindler to have shielded the Jews under his employment from the Gestapo.

Yet, most of the world applauded Schindler for his opposition to Nazi law. A movie was even made of his life.

The difference between Kim Davis and Oskar Schindler is negligible in this case. The problem is simple - the ethos of the time has changed. What was right is now wrong; and what was wrong is now right.

And so, have the courts in the United States of America become contemptible. Christians are the Jews now. And this is no surprise. *The Bible, Government Officials, and Contemptible Courts* 

Daniel was an official in the Babylonian court of King Nebuchadnezzar.

After Daniel disobeyed the king's wicked commandment, he was thrown into the lion's den. When he emerged unscathed, he denied that he had done any wrong.

Daniel 6:22 - "My God hath sent his angel, and hath shut the lions' mouths, that they have not hurt me: forasmuch as before him innocency was found in me; and also before thee, O king, have I done no hurt."

Daniel was clear in conscience before God and before the king. It was the law that was in error, not Daniel.

In John Calvin's *Institutes of the Christian Religion*, he wrote that King Nebuchadnezzar "had exceeded his limits, and not only been injurious to men, but, by raising his horn against God, had virtually abrogated his own power."

Daniel was not quick to obey. But unfortunately, even God's people can be easily deceived. When the golden calf was set up by Jeroboam, the Israelites were too ready to obey his command. They forsook the temple of God and in submissiveness, they obeyed Jeroboam's commands.

John Calvin says, "We are subject to the men who rule over us, but subject only in the Lord. If they command anything against Him let us not pay the least regard to it, nor be moved by all the dignity which they possess as magistrates - a dignity to which no injury is done when it is subordinated to the special and truly supreme power of God."

Therefore, such resistance to tyranny is obedience to God. And while there be certain repercussions on the people of God, our conscience is clear.

Mat Staver, who represents Kim Davis said, "[She] is being treated as a criminal because she cannot violate her conscience. While she may be behind bars for now, Kim Davis is a free woman. Her conscience remains unshackled."

O Lord, give us this courage. ~ Pastor

#### Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 3. What is the Word of God?
