#### Time Is Short, Our Children's Lives Are Unpredictable

Last week, I wrote that time is short and Steven gave his written testimony of his near encounter with death.

In 1 Corinthians 7:29, Paul says, "But this I say, brethren, the time is short." Psalm 89:47 says "Remember how short my time is." Psalm 39:5 says "Behold, thou hast made my days as an handbreadth."

#### Very Sad and Sudden News

This week, we heard that one of the boys living in Mingalar Children's Home, the orphanage we support in Myanmar, had gone home to be with the Lord.

He had died from brain cancer.

This was very sad for those of us who had gone recently. A few of us wept at his passing.

Emanuel was in year 7 at school. He came from a village far from Yangon. His mother, either because she was unable or unwilling to care for him, had sent him to the orphanage.

On Wednesday morning, Emanuel went to school to take his exams. He had finished one paper, and was taking a second when he had severe headaches.

He vomited blood and was taken to the hospital around noon. A CT scan showed a 7 centimeter tumor on his left brain. The doctors decided to perform surgery on him and scheduled it for the next day.

One of the orphanage workers, Tebawihi, stayed with him at night; but at 1 am, early Thursday morning, Myanmar time, he passed away.

The doctors were shocked, as no one expected him to die so soon.

The church is much saddened, the orphanage children are much saddened. I can't imagine how devastated his friends are - they parted for school in

the morning, and never had the chance to say goodbye.

Pastor Kima and his wife Mawite, brought Emanuel's body back to his village and to his mother, to be buried. The journey takes a day and night. What a pastor he is!

We were told by Ma Biaki, one of the Sunday School teachers, that he was a godly young boy. And that he was a good boy in the Sunday School. He feared God and had fruit in his outward life.

Now that the friends in Myanmar have social media, they have set it ablaze with their sorrow. But yet, they do not grieve as those who have no hope, because Emanuel is with his savior.

Our Children's Lives Are Unpredictable

Our time on earth is short and unpredictable. It is the same for our children. Who can tell when they will die? Some of our children may even predecease us.

Knowing how short and unpredictable their lives are, it should cause us to think about their pursuits, their repentance, and their love for God.

Firstly, but not in order of priority, they must pursue their calling. As we must pursue ours, theirs is to be children.

If they are to study, they must pursue their studies with all their might, according to their talents from God.

Some of our children are very intelligent and they will do exceptionally well in their studies.

Some of our children are not as intelligent but they will do exceptionally well according to their abilities.

If they are to play sports or music or other pursuits, they are to do so with all their might.

Our Lord grew in wisdom and stature. Our children must as well.

Secondly, they must pursue the Lord Jesus Christ and his church. The chief end of man is to glorify God and to enjoy him forever.

Jesus Christ is the most important pursuit. His salvation and his Lordship are paramount. We seek him through his Word, through prayer, through worship. We learn to lean on him.

He is not a crutch for our lives, but he is the reason for our lives. There is no life without Christ.

In the words of Johannes Tauler, the 14th century Dominican monk:

As the bridegroom to his chosen,
As the king unto his realm,
As keep unto the castle,
As the pilot to the helm,
So, Lord, art Thou to me.
As the sunshine in the heavens,
As the image in the glass,
As the fruits upon the fig tree,
As the dew upon the grass,
So, Lord, art Thou to me.

And it goes without saying, that if we love Jesus, we would love his body, which is his church. And we would want our children to love the church and his people.

Thirdly, they must be ready to meet God at any time. Our children grow up in church.

We believe that they are children of the covenant. They have the privilege of calling God, Father, not so for the heathen; their prayers are heard by

God, not so for unbelievers; they have the privilege of hearing the gospel, not so for all unbelievers; they are special in the eyes of God, not everyone is.

And yet, they have to trust in Jesus. They have to exercise faith in Christ and come to him for salvation.

And given the unpredictability of life and the fact that our children may predecease us, they are robbed of salvation and a preparedness to meet their maker, when they are not urged to pursue Christ, and when they have no appetite for the things of Christ and his people.

They may have brain cancer. They may die tomorrow. Emanuel had no symptoms. It was acute. It was fast. And so it may be for your child.

Stirring Up an Appetite for God

May we stir up an appetite in our children for their studies and for their other pursuits. But let us stir up an appetite in them for spiritual things and for the church.

In the coming weeks, there will be a change in the church's ministry to children. We desire to give them a solid hour of Sunday School for all ages, to teach them to worship God, and to encourage them to have fellowship with one another.

We pray that you would consider these as important means to stirring up the appetite of your children for God, and for God's people.

# <u>The Prodigal Prophet</u> Jonah 1:1-4, 12, 17, 2:1, 10, 3:3-5, 10, 4:1, 5-9

Jonah never wanted to preach to the Ninevites because he hated them. He ran from God, but God brought him back to preach. When the Ninevites repented, Jonah became angry. He was prodigal (excessive) in his dissatisfaction and anger.

- 1. Dissatisfaction Results When We Reject God's Sovereignty.
  - a. Jonah was bigoted
  - b. Jonah was angry because he rejected God's sovereignty
  - c. Jonah was angry because God didn't act in a manner that met his approval
  - d. Calamities and good things come from God
- 2. The Sovereign God's Heart for the Lost and the Hypocrisy of Christians.
  - a. Jonah is divided into 2 parts.
  - b. Jonah defies God, was shown mercy, and rejoiced
  - c. The Ninevites defied God, were shown mercy, and Jonah was angry
  - d. God saved sovereignly despite man's hypocrisy
- 3. Jonah Reveals Christ.
  - a. Prefigures Christ
  - b. Came from Galilee
  - c. Reveals Christ by his failure

Jonah tells of the greatest missionary endeavor in the Old Testament, by a God who loves the world, but a prophet who didn't. Jesus is the greater Jonah.

- 1. How prodigal are you in your dissatisfaction with God? How can you tell?
- 2. Are there those to whom you will not share the gospel? Why?
- 3. In what way are we and Jonah alike in our failures and our dissatisfaction?
