An Example that Ministers to Others (Part I)

The Little Pharisee in Us

There is a little Pharisee in each of us. He is in me and he is in you. The Pharisees were not necessarily bad people. They had certain standards that they lived according to and they expected others to live to these standards also.

However, they didn't always live up to what they taught. We are all like that to some extent.

We have standards - some of them are Biblical standards and some of them are personal convictions. How we live and how we propagate those convictions are important.

Who Were the Pharisees?

The Pharisees were the Bible teachers and Fundamentalists of their day.

Jesus encouraged his disciples to live according to the Pharisees' biblical teachings, but not to live like them.

Jesus said in Matthew 23:2-3 - *"The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat: all therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do not ye after their works: for they say, and do not."*

What were the works of the Pharisees that Jesus didn't want the people to learn from?

Fault Finding

The Pharisees and Scribes were fault finders. Mark 7:20 says, *"And when they saw some of his disciples eat bread with defiled, that is to say, with unwashen, hands, they found fault."*

They were like chief inspectors - they were always looking for fault, especially in the Lord Jesus. And in finding fault, they became the moral standard for

what was right. Unfortunately, they couldn't see the weightier matters of the law.

Micah 6:8 - *"He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?"*

What is important to God is that we walk humbly before him, we demonstrate mercy, and we do right by everyone.

There is a little Pharisee in each of us. We each have certain standards. But we are very capable of finding fault in others when they do not meet our standards.

Burdening Others Without Helping Them

The Pharisees also put heavy burdens on the people, but wouldn't help them.

Matthew 23:4 says, *"For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers."*

Some of the standards they insisted that people keep were good and biblical. Other standards that they insisted people keep were man-made.

We can impose very heavy standards on others. For example, modesty in dress is important - it shows the heart of a person.

Imposing certain man-made standards of modesty in length or color might solve the problem, but it doesn't address the heart.

There are those by reason of infirmity and immaturity who do not understand the principles of modesty. These things take time to be taught and absorbed by the heart.

We can be like the Pharisees when we don't help others to understand but only insist on their compliance.

Hypocrisy

They were hypocrites. They kept certain standards, but not the important ones.

Matthew 23:23 says, "*Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.*"

For example, they were meticulous in keeping the tithe. They gave 10% of whatever they had to the temple. They even gave 10% of the herbs that grew wild in their gardens!

But what was more important were the things which were more important. We can often miss the forest for the trees.

We are all hypocrites - we often focus on the small things rather than the important things - and we aren't always consistent on the small things. We are reminded that the moral law, justice,

mercy, and faith are far more important. There's a little Pharisee in each one of us.

Preventing Others from Seeing Christ

When we find fault easily, burden others without helping them, and live inconsistently, are we not hindering others from seeing Christ? Do we not make the kingdom harder to pursue?

Matthew 23:13 says, "*But woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye shut up the kingdom of heaven against men: for ye neither go in yourselves, neither suffer ye them that are entering to go in.*"

Will Jesus say the same to others concerning us? "*All therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do not ye after their works: for they say, and do not.*"

Indeed, our works are a far more important message to others than any word we speak.

May the Lord continue to work in us, to give us a character and example that ministers to others. ~ Pastor



Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 82. What is the communion in glory which the members of the invisible Church have with Christ?

A. The communion in glory which the members of the invisible Church have with Christ, is in this life, immediately after death, and at last perfected in their resurrection.

Q. 83. What is the communion in glory with Christ, which the members of the invisible Church enjoy in this life?

A. The members of the invisible Church have communicated to them in this life, the first-fruits of glory with Christ, as they are members of him their head, and so in him are interested in that glory which he is fully possessed of; and, as an earnest thereof, enjoy the sense of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, and hope of glory; as, on the contrary, sense of God's revenging wrath, horror of conscience, and a fearful expectation of judgment, are to the wicked the beginning of the torments which they shall endure after death.

God Brings About His Kingdom
Nehemiah 2:1-9

Nehemiah was a prayerful man because he knew, above all, that God is the one who brings about his kingdom. And after Nehemiah prayed, God did exactly that.

1. God's Sovereign Hand Works for the Good of His Kingdom
 - a. God is the hero, weak men are the instruments
 - b. God moved the pagan kings to fulfil prophecy
 - i. Nebuchadnezzar - exile
 - ii. Cyrus - restoration
 - iii. Darius - temple
 - iv. Artaxerxes - worship
2. God's Sovereignty Helps Us to Prayerfully Wait for Him to Accomplish His Will
 - a. 4 months of praying
 - b. Nehemiah's limit
 - c. Artaxerxes' willingness
3. God's Sovereignty Propels Us to Godly Action
 - a. Nehemiah's planning
 - i. Time
 - ii. Passage
 - iii. Materials
 - b. When God answers a prayer, he answers a prayer.

God is sovereign. We must pray. We must prepare.

Questions:

1. Nehemiah understood that only God could change the heart. Why do we often make the mistake of trying to change someone else's heart, instead of leaving it up to the LORD to do it?
2. Nehemiah had his limitations and eventually showed the toil of his grief after 4 months of intense prayer. Why is it important to be hardy in the service of the Lord and why is it necessary to be gracious to those who struggle with discouragement in service?

Hear the good news that the biblical account of origins is not only historically accurate, but makes better sense of the evidence.
