After a busy week of work, it is very easy to come up with excuses to skip prayer meetings.

However, I believe that God would be well pleased to have His people at His house praying and learning about the things of God.

We are told to take up our cross and follow Him, so sacrificing our Friday nights of rest and leisure is a small sacrifice compared to what Christ has done for us.

I would encourage you all, especially the fathers to lead your family to come for the prayer meetings.

After a loaded week coupled with family commitments and work circumstances, I often struggle to find the motivation and energy to drive to church on Friday night.

At the Friday night classes, we have already studied a number of courses, including the study of the Tabernacle by Daniel Hyde, Martin Luther and the Reformation by RC Sproul, the Sermon of the Mount by Sinclair Ferguson and Apologetics by RC Sproul. Currently we are doing a course on ancient church history by Robert Godfrey.

Some of these talks can be difficult to grasp and the accent of some speakers can be challenging.

But I enjoy the opportunity to explore in depth some interesting topical study through Friday night classes which I may not be able to cover elsewhere.

The current series on ancient church history is particularly encouraging for me to learn about the early church's understanding and their struggle in working through several key doctrines.

Why corporate prayers? I am often reminded in the Scripture, that whenever one man prayed, the church - the nation - is blessed.

I learn that it is God's great mercy and desire for us to pray. Prayer truly is a means of grace and a way to share in God's grace and providence.

While it is not prayer, per se, that makes the difference, but God who answers prayers.

But prayer – a believing, intercessory, constant, and pleading prayer for matters of the church – is one of the great means God is pleased to use to grow each and every one of us and ultimately the church and to advance the gospel work.

Often I have been encouraged through the prayer meetings, when we prayed and interceded for one another corporately.

We then were able to witness answered prayers through trusting in

God's providence and grace in circumstances our fellow believers encountered.

Coming together to pray taught me to look outside of my own problems and on needs of others instead and not merely focus inwardly on my own daily affairs and circumstances only.

Through this, I am compelled to put my personal concerns aside and learn to pray for fellow believers' needs also.

My personal concerns and worries of the day often seem trivial relative to the needs and circumstances of others.

I have also learned to trust and rely on God more because he understands us, knows our thoughts - who we really are - both our strengths and our weaknesses.

I have experienced the peace that comes with submitting to God in prayer. I am reassured, and reminded of God's grace and providence.

Through corporate prayer, I also get to know things that matter to the church and the various ministries of the church as a whole.

I know I will continue to struggle to make this corporate prayer a part of my weekly priority, but I would encourage fellow members and worshipers to come and participate in prayer meetings.

Together, we can share each other's burden and foster greater unity though prayers.
