Is There Something I Must Do After the Lord's Supper?

Next Lord's Day, we will be celebrating the Lord's Supper. We know that before celebrating it, we must prepare for it by self-examination (1 Cor 11:27-31).

We examine ourselves so that we may benefit from it. We think of our sins, grieve for them, and thank God for forgiveness and reconciliation.

But at the same time, we benefit from the Lord's Supper when we leave the Table with a renewed sense of strength. We can't leave the Table and behave as if nothing happened!

Question 175 of the Westminster Larger Catechism teaches us what our duty toward God is after we have received the sacrament.

It teaches us that "The duty of Christians, after they have received the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, is seriously to consider how they have behaved themselves therein, and with what success; if they find quickening and comfort, to bless God for it, beg the continuance of it, watch against relapses, fulfill their vows, and encourage themselves to a frequent attendance on that ordinance: but if they find no present benefit, more exactly to review their preparation to, and carriage at, the Sacrament; in both which, if they can approve themselves to God and their own consciences, they are to wait for the fruit of it in due time: but, if they see that they have failed in either, they are to be humbled, and to attend upon it afterwards with more care and diliaence."

Seriously Consider the Spirit Benefits

We are to consider how we behaved as we partook of it. How did we prepare for it? How did the fellowship meal affect us? How did we react to the memory that Christ suffered for us? Did we feel grief for our sins and joy for our forgiveness? Perhaps he worked in us joy that we truly love the brethren out of a sincere heart.

Yes, there is an experiential side. Psalm 28:7 tells us that there is always a reaction of the heart and mind to the truth of God - "The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped: therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise him."

Did we make use of the Supper successfully? Surely, we did not just go through the motion! There is a right and wrong way to participate in it (1 Cor 11:17).

Pray that God Will Help Us Continue to Experience the Benefits

We are to "beg the continuance of it." Did we enjoy these benefits as we took the Supper? Did our hearts burn in us as we met with Christ (Luke 24:32)?

Thank God for it and plead that our hearts would continue to be excited about him and that we would deepen in our love for Christ. And we must also pray that God would help us to do what we were reminded to do at the Table.

Watch Against Relapses

If Christ has saved us and given us victory, we can't continue in sin; it will rob us of our fellowship with God. Sin robbed David of that joy (Psalm 51).

So those sins which we realized through self-examination, we are to guard against them.

Fulfill Our Vows

We can't partake of the Supper without being confronted with our sins and with the things we need to get right. Perhaps it was vows that we made during the time of self-examination - vows we need to fulfill. Or perhaps God reminded us of the vows we had made previously as members and officers.

If we fail to fulfill those vows after we partake of the elements, our enjoyment of the Supper diminishes and our fellowship with God diminishes.

I find this to be the hardest aspect of the Supper. There is a sense that I can't leave the table of my God and King, who has nourished me spiritually and given me every good gift; who has joined me together with the congregation of God's people; to whom I have made vows; and go away from it with no resolve in my heart to do right and fulfill my vows.

However, it is so easy because these vows are so difficult for me to fulfill. And I partake of the Supper presumptuously when I excuse myself of my duties by trying to assuage my conscience that God has forgiven me for this weakness. By so doing, I have an evil conscience - there is no attempt on my part to obey God. I cheapen the death of Christ.

We Are to Frequently Attend the Lord's Supper

We are to "encourage [ourselves] to a frequent attendance on that ordinance." Therefore, we are not to allow sin to hinder us from coming to the Table.

We are to live carefully until the next Lord's Supper - always to prepare ourselves to come to the Table - living in that victory that Christ has given us and drawing close to him everyday.

This is just like the early Church, who "continued daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of heart" (Acts 2:46).

Reflection

And if we find no present benefit in the Lord's Supper, we are to wait for the fruit, seek after Christ, humble ourselves. Christ seeks to have communion with us at the Table. But because we are distant, we don't always find him.

Because we had not prepared ourselves to meet him by examination, repentance, and reconciliation with others; or because we may have been callous in heart, we may not have found him (Song of Solomon 5:1-6). "I sought him, but I could not find him; I called him, but he gave me no answer" (v 6).

Let us consider what we are missing, and let us pray and resolve to do alright that we may not miss out the blessings that Christ has ordained for us to enjoy through His Supper!

Let us remember what blessing awaits us as individuals and as a church when we come to Christ at his banqueting Table. \sim Pastor



Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 154. What are the outward means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of his mediation?

A. The outward and ordinary means, whereby Christ communicates to his Church the benefits of his mediation, are all his ordinances; especially the Word, Sacraments, and Prayer; all which are made effectual to the elect for their salvation.

Eat Bacon, Peter Acts 10:1-33

People have always erected walls - to denote who was on the inside and who was on the outside - who was elite, and who was not. God had erected his own wall as well - those on the inside were ceremonially pure. But God was about to tear down that wall - so that all men who believed in Christ would be made ceremonially clean.

- 1. An Unsaved Gentile Called by God
 - Cornelius was Gentile
 - b. Cornelius was pious
 - c. Cornelius was unsaved
- 2. A Stubborn Religious Man Changed by God
 - Peter's call
 - b. Peter's stubbornness
 - c. Peter's change of heart
- 3. A Wall Broken Down by God
 - a. Peter and Cornelius are equal
 - God has torn down that wall

While the wall erected by God was to teach a spiritual lesson of cleanliness achieved by Christ, man erects his own walls where he is elite - this is seen in education, status, wealth, race, etc. We need to see each other as equals. Christ has removed that wall (Eph 2).

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. Do you see yourself as better than others? Do you get angry at those who see themselves better than you? What does that tell you about the wall you have erected?
- 2. Are there walls erected in this church? What are they? Why do you think they are erected when Christ has removed the wall and given us the gospel of which we once didn't have?
