Dr Bob Jones III and Mrs Beneth Peters Jones

Our speaker for the upcoming Bible Conference this week is Dr Bob Jones III. Pastor Ed, our founding pastor, graduated from Bob Jones University, the school founded by Dr Jones' grandfather.

He and his wife will be with us for a week. After speaking at the Bible Conference, they will both speak at the Men's and Ladies' Seminars next Saturday. Dr Bob will also be ministering to us at our seventh anniversary.

Please be praying for these teaching ministries of the church, and for these speakers.

Here is a brief biographical write up about them.

Dr Bob Jones III

Bob Jones III is the chancellor of Bob Jones University in Greenville, S.C.

He grew up in a Christian home and trusted Christ as his personal Savior in his early high school years.

He earned both the bachelor of arts and the master of arts degrees from BJU.

He has taken additional graduate work at Northwestern University and New York University and holds honorary doctorates from Pillsbury Baptist Bible Jones has been influential in Christian education and in the pulpit ministry.

He has served in numerous capacities at Bob Jones University, including those of speech teacher, assistant dean of men, assistant to the president and vice president.

He was appointed president in 1971 and served until May 2005 when he was elected as chancellor.

He served as chairman of the Board of Trustees from 1998 to 2014.

He was the third to hold those offices since the University was founded in 1927 by his late grandfather.

Each year Dr. Jones receives more requests than he is able to fill for evangelistic campaigns, youth rallies and other religious gatherings.

His speaking engagements have taken him to all parts of the world.

He is married to the former Beneth Peters; and they have three children, six grandchildren and three greatgrandchildren.

Mrs Beneth Peters Jones

A native of Washington State, Beneth Peters Jones earned the bachelor of arts degree in speech interpretation from Bob Jones University, was then awarded a graduate assistantship in

> speech and completed the master of arts degree.

> She has also studied at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois.

> Beneth has directed and appeared often in the well-known

College in Owatonna, Minnesota; San Francisco Baptist Theological Seminary in California; and Maranatha Baptist Bible College in Watertown, Wisconsin.

A third-generation preacher, Dr.



Vespers programs at BJU as well as on university-produced, nationally distributed radio programs.

In addition to directing productions for the BJU Classic Players, she has played a number of leading roles—including Roxane in *Cyrano de Bergerac*, Katherine in *The Taming of the Shrew*, Ophelia in *Hamlet*, Juliet in *Romeo and Juliet*, and Lady Macbeth in *Macbeth*.

She has been featured in several Christian films produced by Unusual Films, the University's motion-picture unit.

Her latest role was in Sheffey, the award-winning film about Robert Sayers Sheffey, a circuit-riding preacher.

The courtship that later led to her marriage to Dr. Bob Jones III, now chancellor of Bob Jones University, began when Beneth portrayed Roxane and he played Christian in Cyrano.

They named their daughter Roxane. The Joneses also have two sons —Bob IV and Stephen — and six grandchildren and three greatgrandchildren.

Beneth wrote and recorded the feature *Sunshine on the Soapsuds* for the popular radio program by the same name.

Many of these articles have been compiled into three books, *Sunshine* on the Soapsuds, More Sunshine on the Soapsuds and Lights on Main Street.

She has also written *In the Best Possible Light*, a handbook on Christian loveliness; *Ribbing Him Rightly!*, a book on Christian wifehood; *Words Fitly Spoken*, a booklet for public speaking; *The Wilderness Within*, which addresses a woman's testings in emotions and attitudes; and *Mount Up on Wounded Wings*, a book for Christian women with hurtful home backgrounds.

She has also co-authored *With Heart and Hand*, a manual for women in God's service, and her video series, *Patterns for the Christian Woman*.

Much more important and treasured to Beneth than any of the "dones" noted above is God's grace in allowing and enabling her to be a wife, mother and grandmother and a friend to her Christian sisters throughout America and overseas.

In each writing or speaking opportunity God gives her, Beneth's desire is to "come alongside" Christian women with scriptural encouragement for their daily lives.

Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 139. What are the sins forbidden in the seventh commandment?

A. The sins forbidden in the seventh commandment, besides the neglect of the duties required, are, adultery, fornication, rape, incest, sodomy, and all unnatural lusts; all unclean imaginations, thoughts, purposes, and affections; all corrupt or filthy communications, or listening thereunto, wanton looks, impudent or light behaviour, immodest apparel; prohibiting of lawful, and dispensing with unlawful marriages; allowing, tolerating, keeping of stews, and resorting to them; entangling vows of single life, undue delay of marriage; having more wives or husbands than one at the same time; unjust divorce, or desertion; idleness, gluttony, drunkenness, unchaste company; lascivious songs, books, pictures, dancings, stage plays; and all other provocations to, or acts of uncleanness, either in ourselves or others.

Love One Another As I Have Loved You John 15:9-17

People often say the most important things just before crucial events - a departure, a death, an operation. Likewise, before Jesus went to the cross, he spoke important words to his disciples - "This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you." This was a command. If the word of Christ should dwell in us richly (Col 3:16), how are we to follow this commandment?

- 2. If we refuse to obey the command to love, will we grow in joy, friendship with Christ, and fruitfulness? Will we abide in Christ's love? How important is it to you to have these consequences of obedience?
