******* Westminster Larger Catechism

O. 143. Which is the ninth commandment?

A. The ninth commandment is, Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

Q. 144. What are the duties required in the ninth commandment?

A. The duties required in the ninth commandment are, the preserving and promoting of truth between man and man, and the good name of our neighbor, as well as our own; appearing and standing for the truth; and from the heart, sincerely, freely, clearly, and fully, speaking the truth, and only the truth, in matters of judgment and justice, and in all other things whatsoever; a charitable esteem of our neighbors; loving, desiring, and rejoicing in their good name; sorrowing for, and covering of their infirmities; freely acknowledging of their gifts and graces, defending their innocency; a ready receiving of a good report, and unwillingness to admit of an evil report, concerning them; discouraging talebearers, flatterers, and slanderers; love and care of our own good name, and defending it when need requireth; keeping of lawful promises; studying and practicing of whatsoever things are true, honest, lovely, and of good report.

The Real Story of the Temple Acts 7:44-53

When a person tears down your identity marker - that which distinguishes you and gives you value - you feel violated. Identity markers can be racial, educational, or even spiritual. They blind a person to his lack of real righteousness. The Sanhedrin prided themselves on God's presence with them in the Temple. But the temple was not what they thought it was.

- 1. The History of the Temple Is a History of God's Goodness
 - a. It testified of God's presence
 - b. It was given to them despite their idolatry
 - c. It led them to the Promised Land
 - d. It was a testament of God's goodness to David
- 2. The Temple Is Severely Limited But Was Idolized
 - a. The temple could not contain God
 - God is transcendent
 - c. The Jews idolized the temple
- 3. Deeply Religious People Can Be the Worst Hypocrites
 - a. They were like unbelievers
 - b. The objective of the law of love
 - c. The self-righteous do not love

In each of us there is a legalist. When we feel that we are righteous, we will find ourselves despising others who do not do what we we do. But the message of the temple is that we are terribly bad, and that Christ saves us by his atoning sacrifice. Christ was the only human being who was free from self-righteousness because he was completely righteous. He was the Messiah but the only one truly free of a messiah complex.

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. In what ways do you box God up and limit him?
- 2. If the objective of the law and commandments of God is love, how is Christ's righteousness in you expressing itself to your enemies and those who are less holy?
- 3. What damnable good works might you need to repent of?
