The Need for Wisdom

A Wise Request

When Aladdin came across a lamp, he rubbed it and out came a genie. It gave him 3 wishes.

Even though he wanted the hand of the princess in marriage, Aladdin did not ask for that. Instead, he asked for riches and power so that he could win the princess' hand.

That led him into a lot of problems.

On the other hand, when Solomon was crowned king after his father died, God asked him what his singular wish was.

Solomon didn't ask for a princess. Neither did he ask for wealth or power. But Solomon asked for wisdom - to know right from wrong.

He was already wise in making that request.

So wise was Solomon that the Queen of Sheba came to see for herself. And she concluded that because he was wise, "Happy are thy men, happy are these thy servants, which stand continually before thee, and that hear thy wisdom" (1 Kings 10:8).

Do we have wisdom?

The Definition of "Wisdom"

What is wisdom? The Hebrew word for "wisdom" is used in the Old Testament to refer to skill.

Exodus 28 speaks about the skill and wisdom of the tailors who sewed Aaron's priestly garments. Exodus 35 speaks about the skill and wisdom of the people who built the tabernacle.

While anyone can build a tabernacle, not anyone can build THE tabernacle.

Jeremiah 10:12 speaks about how God established the world by his wisdom. He created it by his power, but he exercised that power by wisdom.

That is why after each day, he proclaimed his creation "good" and after

6 days, he proclaimed it "very good." His power with wisdom created good things.

This is my Father's world,

The birds their carols raise.

The morning light, the lily white,

Declare their maker's praise.

Therefore, in Proverbs, wisdom is the skill of applying the knowledge we have.

Proverbs 14:29 gives us skill not to be angry; it says, "He that is slow to wrath is of great understanding: but he that is hasty of spirit exalteth folly."

Proverbs 11:32 teaches us to control our words, "The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable: but the mouth of the wicked speaketh frowardness."

Proverbs 25:7 teaches us to be good guests - "Withdraw your foot from your neighbor's house; lest he be weary of you, and so hate you."

These verses teach us wisdom how to apply what we already know.

The Effects of Wisdom

What happens when you exercise wisdom and skillfully apply the Word of God?

Proverbs 1:4-5 says that we will grow in maturity - "To give subtilty to the simple, to the young man knowledge and discretion. A wise man will hear, and will increase learning; and a man of understanding shall attain unto wise counsels."

The simple will grow in subtlety, in prudence, in shrewdness, in cunning. This is what Jesus meant by being as wise as serpents in an innocent way.

Being shrewd and cunning is not how to get away with not paying your parking fine by sweet talking the cop. Neither is it getting back more tax returns because you took advantage of that loophole. Wisdom is not a oneupmanship in quile. Wisdom is from God. So it's a subtlety and shrewdness in exercising the purity of God.

It also gives the young man - the inexperienced - discretion. Literally, it is "device." It means craftiness. But it is not a craftiness to do evil - rather, it's a craftiness to escape from evil.

In Proverbs, the young man is often exhorted to flee from the strange woman and to escape from bad friends. It takes skill to stay away from sinful influences.

Do we find ourselves easily influenced? Easily angered? Easily duped? We are not wise and we need wisdom.

The Complement of Wisdom

Wisdom is only complete when it is accompanied by the fear of the Lord.

Proverbs 1:7 says, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

Why would a person not want to get out of a parking fine by sweet talking? Why wouldn't you want to use that loophole to get more money back?

Because we fear the Lord. Therefore, when there is no fear, there is no wisdom.

And it is the beginning of wisdom. This does not mean that fear is the first step and then you move away from it. Rather, it is the principal thing - you must have fear to have wisdom.

What is fear? Throughout the Bible, we see that fear is the response of those who see God. When Moses was at the burning bush, he was terrified. When Isaiah had the vision of God's throne room, he was terrified - woe is me!

This was the same reaction to Jesus. When Jesus told Peter where to fish, and he got a boatload of fish as a result, Peter said - depart from me Lord, for I am a sinful man.

When Jesus appeared in blazing white clothes at the Transfiguration, and a voice from heaven said - this is my beloved son - his disciples fell on their faces and were terrified.

Fear is the response of those who see God. It is a person's attitude toward God. No fear, no wisdom. Why? Because when there's no fear, there's no obedience.

But the fool despises wisdom. There's always an explanation, a justification, an excuse. Therefore, the fool does not lack knowledge, but obedience. He isn't ill-informed, rather he's wicked.

Jesus Is Our Wisdom

Solomon, wise as he was, ceased to fear God. It destroyed his kingdom. But the greater son of David was filled with the spirit of wisdom and understanding.

As a child, he increased in wisdom - when he preached, the people marveled. No one feared God like he did.

To have that wisdom of God, we need to look at the cross - where a wise man died in the place of fools like you and me.

To learn his skill, his obedience, who because he was wise and shrewd, did not escape death, but went headlong into it.

Accomplishments Are Vain Ecclesiastes 2:1-26

Man thinks he can build a peaceful society that lasts. He can't. We wish for a time when we can say "And they lived happily ever after." But there will never be a time like this on earth. No where, not even the church, is spared from difficulty. All life under the sun is vanity and vexation of spirit. Ecclesiastes 2 calls us to evaluate our attitude toward our accomplishments in life.

- 1. Accomplishments Are Good
 - a. His ambitions in life
 - b. They were legitimate
- 2. Accomplishments Are Vain
 - a. Because of death and imperfection
 - b. Enjoying accomplishments in Christ

There are many joys in a crooked world. There are many good gifts - in our homes, in our work, in our church. But we don't see it because we have not surrendered. We are still expecting things to work the way we see fit. But we are not surrendering ourselves. We don't realize we are broken in our thinking. But the Lord Jesus Christ's body was broken, that we might be made healed in our thinking about the world and about our accomplishments.

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. In what way are you broken in your understanding of your work, achievements, and relationships? How has your understanding caused you dissatisfaction with these things in your life?
- 2. How does surrender to Christ help you to deal with the messiness of the world? How does it help you to deal with disappointments in work, family, and church?
