Testimonies from the Bible Lands Study Tour to Israel and Jordan I

It Evoked Powerful Feelings and Fmotions

The Israel & Jordan tour was one of the most memorable trips I've had for different reasons.

Never having been to the Middle East before, it was exciting to explore new places and try different foods.

However this trip was also more than that - it was educational and evoked powerful feelings and emotions. Educational because Israel and Jordan are steeped in history and are constantly in the media.

We had a historian as our tour guide an author of 3 books about Israel, who lectures on the subject in the USA. Ronnie Simon, our guide spoke from an Israeli's perspective and talked freely about current political events.

Pastor Mark gave a biblical and spiritual perspective helping us to link places with the Bible. He was constantly peppered with questions as the group tried to crystallize their biblical understanding but did not seem to mind.

As a Sunday school teacher, I was familiar with names of biblical towns such as Tiberias, Capernaum and Nebo but they were still just names from the Bible.

Until you are standing there, taking in the surroundings, does the Bible become alive. You can visualize how people in that era may have lived as you connect the town with the Bible accounts.

One thing that stood out was when we retraced the last days of Jesus. We walked down the Mount of Olives and visited the gardens of Gethsemane and agony. We saw Golgotha - the skull place where Jesus was crucified. We visited the beautiful Garden Tomb where Jesus' body was buried and resurrected.

There was a sign at the tomb's entrance saying "He is not here for he has risen." The Garden evoked a sense peace and contemplation. We also had the Lord's Supper there, being grateful for Christ's sacrifice and our salvation.

Although our tour was jam packed with plenty to explore and see, it was never overwhelming as there was always a fun activity added.

We went on camel rides, walked through Hezekiah's wet tunnel, and swam at the Dead Sea. There are still plenty more places that we have yet to visit and I look forward to a Part 2 trip.

There was no discomfort in any way as we stayed in nice hotels, ate great food and enjoyed a comfortable air conditioned bus driven by expert drivers.

We also felt safe and secure throughout our travels, allowing us to delve fully into what we were learning and what God was teaching us about Himself.

I was pleasantly surprised with how many sites and artifacts we were shown. I especially enjoyed the Masada fortress, the Qumran Caves, Tel Megiddo, Mount Carmel, and the Mount of Beatitudes.

Of course, the sites in Jerusalem were wonderful. I loved viewing Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives across the Kidron Valley, visiting the Israel museum, and walking through the City of David.

We had a wonderful time of praise and worship on the boat ride in the Sea of Galilee. It gave me a sense that I had travelled back 2,000 years ago to what was written in Matthew 4:13 - "And leaving Nazareth, he came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is upon the sea coast in the borders of Zabulon and Nephthalim."

It was a great experience to walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel - this engineering marvel of the ancient world.

It would be a tragedy to be in Jerusalem and not walk through this tunnel. The tunnel is narrow, but not too narrow that we can't walk through.

The visit to the Garden Tomb was quite emotional and contemplative. We had the Lord's Supper there; with the fruit of

the vine in a wooden cup. It was an experience that I will never ever forget.

At Golgotha or Calvary, my breath was taken away to see right in front of me a place taken off the pages of history. It was a very reverential time.

We sung "Be Thou My Vision" in Church of Saint Anne located near the Lions' Gate and the Pool of Bethesda.

The austere stone interior and extraordinary acoustics made it a fine example of medieval architecture and a place in which anyone can sound good singing! It was a place like no other in the world! It was an experience you will never forget, when you are in The Holy Land.

Swimming in the Dead Sea was quite an experience but unfortunately I didn't float on the surface of the water due to the high tide!

Overall, I had enjoyed every place we visited, everyone whom I met, and all the food that I had during the trip.

I can't thank Pastor Mark and the tour guides enough. Their knowledge of the Bible, history, and archaeology really brought everything together and will forever change the way I read the Bible.

God has changed my life and my faith has been enhanced. I left Israel enriched spiritually, intellectually, and emotionally.

I highly recommend taking a trip to Israel with Pastor Mark. God-willing, I hope to join Pastor for another trip to Israel in the near future. Thank you. God Bless.
