Bearing the Marks of Christ

Danjuma was 13 years old when his Christian village in Nigeria was attacked by the Islamic terrorist group, Boko Haram.

The radical Muslims burned homes, churches, and attacked the villagers.

Danjuma tried to run but was struck multiple times by a machete (long, sharp knife). He lost his right eye and bears a scar across his face.

His radiant smile drew me to this young man who I am honored to address my dear brother in Christ when I read his story in August 2015 issue of the Voice of the Martyrs (VOM) newsletter.

Danjuma, despite the pain he endured, robbed of his childhood, bears the marks of Christ through his scars with a beautiful smile, radiating a joy that surpasses all understanding.

He has forgiven his attackers as he says, "I forgive them because they don't know what they are doing. If they had love, they wouldn't behave that way."

The villagers thought Danjuma was dead after they found his almost lifeless body and dug his grave to bury him. However, that was not the day for Danjuma to go home to meet his Maker.

Danjuma like several other brothers and sisters of ours is a witness and testimony for me personally that it is worth everything even my life to suffer for Christ our Savior for the atonement He alone has paid as a ransom for my sin.

I became a volunteer for the Voice of the Martyrs in January of 2012 to be a blessing to my persecuted sisters and brothers in Christ.

I was so mistaken.

God has used and is using the persecuted church to be a blessing in my life and helping me understand what Christ meant when He said in His sermon on the mount, "Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:10.

The radiance in Danjuma's smile comes from the forgiveness he has displayed to his attackers because of our Savior .

Jesus has said, "But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust." Matt 5:44-45.

My dearest family at Covenant B-P Church, as I bid you farewell today, I come to you with a plea to pray for our persecuted sisters and brothers in Christ who are suffering for their faith in our Risen Savior and King Jesus Christ.

They do not ask for persecution to stop but they ask that their faith not be shaken in the midst of persecution. They will stay true to His calling until they go home to meet our King.

God has used our persecuted family in Christ to convict me of the comforts I so struggle to let go off for

Christ and to live a life completely surrendered to God no matter what the cost.

They are part of our family as we all are members of the body of Christ and we remember them like we do our immediate family or friends.

As Merv Knight the founder of Voice of the Martyrs Australia once said, "One day we will stand in heaven before our Maker. Standing next to us will be our persecuted sisters and brothers who we could have served but waited for an other opportune time" (paraphrased).

What will your response be? The time to serve them is now. Let us start by praying for them every day of our lives. Pray that they will -

- Sense God's presence (Heb 13:5)
- Know the greater body of Christ is praying for them (2 Tim. 1:3)
- Experience God's comfort when persecuted (2 Thess. 2:16-17)
- See God open doors to evangelism (Col. 4:3)
- Boldly share the gospel (Acts 4:29)
- Forgive and love their persecutors (Matt 5:44)
- Be granted wisdom in covert ministry work (Acts 9:23-25)

- Remain joyful amid suffering (Acts 5:41)
- Mature in their faith (Col. 1:28-29)
- Be rooted in God's word (2 Tim. 3:16-17)
