The Book of Proverbs

One of my favourite Bible books is Proverbs. Over my ministry I have preached through the Book a number of times because of its relevance to us today, so I take this opportunity to share some of its gems with you. We won't look at every proverb, but I will pick some out and see what they have to say to us about life.

Proverbs is a very practical book. When we read Proverbs we read about paths of action that should be avoided. We should heed the warnings and stay away from that path. We do not have to learn the hard way. And on the positive side, when Proverbs describes for us the path that we should be walking, then that is the path we should be on.

There are two ways we can learn about life. We can learn from experience - we go the wrong way and we reap the consequences. Now, I know that when we go the wrong way, we can and should, in fact we must, come to God in confession.

But remember that while God forgives, nature does not.

The other way we can learn is from God's Word, and so we avoid the wrong path and therefore avoid the consequences and the harm done along the way.

Proverbs 1:2-4 tell us why proverbs was written - "The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel: to know wisdom and instruction, to perceive the words of understanding, the to receive instruction of wisdom, justice, equity; aive iudament, and prudence to the simple, to the knowledge voung man and discretion."

The 'simple' in verse 4 is the person who is easily influenced especially by group pressure.

Proverbs will give prudence to a person under peer pressure. Prudence is the capacity, or the ability, to be able to evaluate the pro and cons of a situation and to be able to seize the opportunity for the best possible good

So not only does it mean that we do not get sucked in, it also means we make the best use of the opportunity.

Verse 4 again 'to the young man knowledge and discretion' In other words, a knowledge of Proverbs will give us wisdom beyond our years. A student who believes the Bible, and knows that God created this world, has far more wisdom on that issue than their evolutionary minded teacher who may have a string of degrees after their name.

While that teacher will only have a string of theories about the origin of everything, that young child can tell that teacher, graciously, of course, how it all began. They will have wisdom beyond the years

And these words - wisdom, understanding, judgment, discretion, justice, equity - are going to appear over and over again in the Book of Proverbs in different ways as God shows us how to avoid the wounds of bad choices made by living by our own judgment that is not being transformed by our daily intake of the Word of God

Verse 5 says, "A wise man will hear and increase learning, and a man of understanding will attain wise counsel." What is the message? We should know it. There is a positive sense in which every person is our teacher because every person will know something that I do not know, and in that sense, they are my teacher.

3 things stand out about wisdom in verse 5 - when we hear it, we increase in learning, and attain wise counsel. Just because we have heard something over and over again, that does not necessarily mean that we have learnt it yet.

So the basic lesson of verse 5 is that we shouldn't think we know it all, but we are to continue to learn - ever the student. A wise saying goes something like this - "He gathers what he hears, he spends what he teaches. If we spend BEFORE or FASTER than we gather we will soon prove to be bankrupt.
