The Book of Proverbs (2)

We are focusing on Proverbs 1 and up to verse 7 which is the central theme of God's philosophy for life - "the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

Without God in our thinking we cannot arrive at the right conclusions to the basic issues of life.

As we look at our culture we see the degeneration. A generation ago we had much more of a Christian ethic within the structure of the culture of Australia. Today we live very much in a post-Christian culture and so we see the results, the much more blatant immorality, the over-emphasis on the rights of the criminal, the worship of the creature rather than the Creator in some of the animal activist groups, etc.

Some would save a calf from the slaughterhouse but would defend killing the unborn baby.

All evidence that without the 'fear of the Lord' we do not have the 'beginning' or the 'foundation' on which to build our knowledge and so our knowledge will let us down when we need it the most.

Without God, knowledge is distorted.

We see this through history. The Greeks believed that the gods enjoyed playing tricks on man and so if they came across a fossil in a rock that looked like a fish, it was most

likely not a fish, but the gods had made it to look like a fish to fool man. Their foundation, or their beginning of wisdom, was wrong.

Is that really as strange as it sounds? What about in our day? When an evolutionary anthropologist sees some bones, what are they to him? They would say that they are evidence that we came from a monkey.

Why? Because his foundation, or the 'beginning of his wisdom' is wrong.

Now we ask how it is possible for some people to be brilliant in their particular field and yet still godless, that they do not fear the Lord? How can this be?

The answer is that they possess some of the superstructure of knowledge, but no foundation, and so the philosophy of life that they live by is flawed. They may have some of the branches, but they've missed the roots.

That godless doctor may be brilliant in telling what is wrong with the body, but he will have just a string of theories about the origin of the human body. He will certainly have no foundation for human morality except his personal preference on issues like abortion, transgenderism, homosexuality, euthanasia, etc.

That linguist who is an ungodly person may know a lot about language structure but as far as the origin of languages is concerned, they will only have theories.

But a child who believes the Bible will have more wisdom in that area than the non-Christian teacher. The non-Christian teacher may have the structure, but the God-fearing student has the foundation

Verses 8 and 9 say, "My son, hear the instruction of your father, and do not forsake the law of your mother; for they will be a graceful ornament on your head, and chains about your neck."

The message of this passage is that true beauty in a child is obedience. It is for this reason that we who are parents should praise our children for character more than for talent because there are varying degrees of talent, as we all know. Some children have much, some have less.

But every child can develop good character!

Therefore, the message to parents is this - praise character and obedience more than talent. Verses 10 and 11 say, "My son, if sinners entice you, do not consent. If they say, "come with us, let us lie in wait to shed blood; let us lurk secretly for the innocent without cause..."

This tells us to hang around with the right crowd.

We need to choose our friends from among those people who will encourage us and help to direct us in the right paths. One of the exciting things about being a Christian is that Jesus sorts our friends out for us.

Our friends will be those people who choose to accept us with our relationship with Jesus and with whom we can fellowship. Those who cannot accept us in that relationship will not choose to be our friends.

So Jesus sorts the friends out for us. Isn't that exciting?
