## Pressing on Toward God's High Calling in Christ Jesus

Indeed, our Heavenly Father is a God who will never leave us nor forsake us. We thank God for His faithfulness and goodness.

Paul in Ephesians 2:19-22 says, "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God: And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone; 21 In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: 22 In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit." The church is built nogu firm foundation of faith, with Jesus Christ beina Chief the Cornerstone.

As we reflect on the ministry of days gone by, we always recall about the past events that have great impact on our lives. The past can have such a hold on us, isn't it? We tend to live in the past. The past brings us memories.

We know the good times. We've celebrated them, and we can

recount every beautiful precious memory by heart. We often wish for those good times again so that we can feel the joy, warmth, and peace they brought to us. Some of us remember the painful times a lot more than the good memories. We know how they make us feel. We know how we react to them. We know the emotions the past brings up so do we relive them over and over and over again.

Isaiah 43:18-19 Do not remember the former things, Nor consider the things of old. Behold, I will do a new thing, Now it shall spring forth . . ." The Bible tells us to not even remember the things of the past, never mind about finding comfort in them. God tells us to not even consider the things of old. Don't remember it. He is doing a NEW THING.

When I was an L-plate learner, my driving instructor would often advise me not to always look at the rear-view mirror. I was told to look at the road ahead and focus on where I was going."

Our life's journey is sometimes compared to running a race. We have to focus and move on towards the finishing line. We have to stop looking at life's rearview mirror and learn to look ahead to what God has planned for us.

Philippians 3:13-14 tells us, "But this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forth into those things which are before, I pressed toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." Paul is pointing out a fact: He says we are to let go of the past and strive toward the future.

Everyone of us carries some form of emotional garbage.

Ephesians 4:31 tells us, "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate toward one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ, God forgave you."

- We rehearse our resentments. We go over and over our bitterness, the people we're angry against, and the people that have hurt us.
- We remember our regrets, the things we've felt guilty about, the things that we regret ("If only...") and remember those things.

• We reinforce our remorse. And we feel down.

With God's help, let us all learn that when we carry that emotional garbage, it tends to cause us to react to relationships from our past rather than enjoying our present relationships and seeing them in their true light. We have to let go of that garbage and learn to build a good relationship with others.

How do you spell RELIEF? Paul says in verse 12, "I let go of the past and I hold on to the future." Forget the former and look forward to the future I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.
