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The Need for Godly Speech

A Talking God Created Us to Talk

Our God is living God. He is a powerful God who spoke the world into existence. He said, *"Let there be light"* and there was.

He revealed himself to Adam by calling to him. He also spoke to Abraham. From the burning bush, he called Moses. And when he came to be born as a man, he was called the Word.

And God has created us to be people who talk. And he expects our speech to reflect his likeness.

This is why 2 of the 10 commandments deal with speech. Every idle word will be judged by God.

We Are Not Perfect in Speech

All of us will fail in our speech. We will take the name of God in vain and we will bear false witness.

We are sinners.

But God always gives us the opportunity to repent.

When Adam and Eve sinned, they had the chance to repent. But because of the fall, Adam blamed Eve and God; and Eve blamed the serpent.

When Isaiah was called, he admitted that he was a person of unclean lips from a people of unclean lips.

In order for Isaiah to do the work of God, an angel had to cleanse his lips with a piece of coal from the altar.

As a redeemed people, our lips have also been cleansed. We use them to bring life and preserve life.

The Power of Our Speech

Proverbs 18:21 says, *"Death and life are in the power of the tongue."*

By the tongue, death can be caused. And by the tongue, life can be preserved.

The judge can pronounce a guilty verdict or he can grant amnesty.

Death and life may not just be physical death and life but also emotional. People are discouraged or encouraged by words.

Words can be life giving. Proverbs 12:18 - *"...but the tongue of the wise is health."*

But unfortunately, words have been used to hurt. Proverbs 25:18 - *"A man that beareth false witness against his neighbour is a maul, and a sword, and a sharp arrow."* Words can be used like a maul (club) to hurt others.

All of us have been victims. But more than that, we are all perpetrators. We have all wielded the club on others.

The tongue can be used to hurt a family, a community, and a church.

It only takes 2 people. One to start the negativity and another who doesn't confront the sin. What you permit, you promote.

The tongue can be used to heal a relationship. *"Hey, I wanna talk to you about John Smith."* *"Oh, he's over there - let's go and talk to him now."*

The Beauty of Our Speech

Because we are sinful, we are prone to speaking ugly things. Why? Because our hearts are ugly. *"Out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaketh."*

But as believers, we have been cleansed. We are new creatures in Christ. Our hearts are filled with the grace of God.

Therefore, we are to speak gracious words. Proverbs 16:24 - *"Pleasant (or gracious) words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones."*

These are words that bring health and healing. We may speak right words, but our words may not be gracious.

And gracious words are persuasive. Proverbs 16:21 says *"The wise in heart shall be called prudent: and the*

sweetness of the lips increaseth learning (increase persuasiveness)."

Gracious words must also be timely. And this is where we fail. *"I must tell the truth and I must say it now!"*

But timely words are good. Proverbs 15:23 - *"A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth: and a word spoken in due season, how good is it!"*

We may have a legitimate complaint against others. But the Bible tells us to bring it to them and not others.

Proverbs 27:6 - *"Faithful are the wounds of a friend."* A friend will minister to a friend and not complain to others.

The beauty of our speech is seen in its graciousness, its timeliness, and its motivation.

The Source of Our Speech

Why do we find it so hard to speak like God does? It is because of our hearts.

We've all gone through relationship problems and controversy. And this is due to our inopportune speech.

And we berate ourselves and vow - *"I've said too much, it's best I remain silent from now on!"* But we find ourselves soon again vowing not to do it! Why?

It is because our tongues are tied to our hearts. And if our hearts don't change, neither can our speech.

Proverbs 10:20 - *"The tongue of the just is as choice silver: the heart of the wicked is little worth."* The tongue is related to the heart. The heart produces the words, and the words exposes the heart.



Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q. 25. How doth Christ execute the office of a priest?

A. Christ executeth the office of a priest, in his once offering up of himself a sacrifice to satisfy divine justice, and reconcile us to God; and in making continual intercession for us.

Proverbs 4:23 says, *"Keep thy heart with all diligence for out of it are the issues of life."* This means that everything, including words, flow from the heart.

If hearts aren't changed and washed, divisive words will continue. If they are not spoken in public, nor to the ones they concern, then they will be spoken in small groups.

Conclusion

Our words are a barometer of our spiritual lives. We must recognize our love for gossip, lying, profanity, and contention.

And this is true of all of us except Jesus. He never spoke in a wrong way. He was always perfect and wise in speaking to the people.

But when what he said shamed them, they killed them. When he spoke the truth, they killed them.

But that is why he died - so that in his body, he would bear every foolish word we have ever spoken. He took our lies, slander, gossip - all we have wrongly spoken; and he bore our guilt for all that we should have rightly spoken but didn't.

This is why God accepts us even though we are so unwise in our speech.

And such a knowledge drives us to Christ - to live the gospel by forgiving, by encouraging, and by asking God to renew our speech.
